Brief of activities or projects undertaken by the entity in past 3 years	a. <u>Gattepalli Watershed Project:</u> With support of Rs 184.00 Lacs from Atlas Copco in 2018 for 4 years, it is being implemented in Indervelly Mandal of Adilabad. In the year 2021-22, Rs 29.70 Lacs were spent benefitting 251 new farmers. As on 31st March, 2022, the project has benefited 376 families and improved water resources for 408 acres. b. <u>Minumuluru Watershed Development Project:</u> With support of Rs 250.00 Lacs from CONCOR in 2019 for 3 years, a spring shed project involves the lateral diversions of perennial streams for irrigation is being implemented in Paderu, Andhra Pradesh. In the year 2021-22, Rs 47.60 Lacs were spent. Among other things, perennial

irrigation was made available to 210 Acres. Cumulatively, 413 Acres have been benefited under the perennial irrigation by this project.

c. Walgonda Watershed Project

With support of Rs 135.15 Lacs from NABARD and Rs 10.00 Lacs from Nuziveedu (for Boulder Removal) in 2021 for 3 years, this micro watershed is being implemented in Indervelly Mandal of Adilabad.

In the year 2021-22, the project is under the Detailed Project Report preparation phase. This project will be benefiting 242 families.

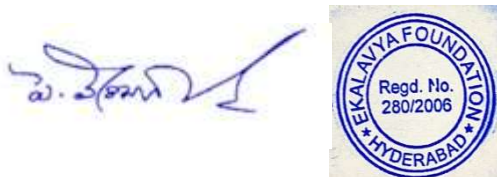
2. Climate Proofing Project (CPP):

With support of Rs 50 Lacs from NABARD in 2019 for 3 years, this project is being implemented in 6 villages of Indervelly Mandal, Adilabad to increase resilience of the watershed and build adaptive capacities of the communities.

In the year 2021-22, activities were carried out to the tune of Rs 10.00 Lacs.

3. Sustainable Farm based Livelihood (Boulder Removal):

With the support of Nuziveedu Seeds and many other donors, this project is being implemented in Adilabad and Asifabad districts to render the non-cultivable land due to big boulders dislodged and



cleared off. Farmers get this additional land to support their livelihood and it is an asset that remains with them forever.

During the year 2021-22, Foundation helped reclaim 285 acres of farmland with the total capital outlay of Rs 19.95 Lakhs.

2. Tribal Development and Income Generation

1. Pochampally Maa Thota Plantation Project:

With support of Rs 293.63 Lacs from NABARD in 2020 for 4 years, this project is being implemented in tribal heartland of Indervelly Mandal, Adilabad to develop Horticultural crops and non-farm-based livelihoods for 500 families.

In the year 2021-22, this program provided benefits to 173 families with the total outlay of Rs 56.98 Lacs.

2. Sustainable Livelihood Development Project (SLDP)

With support of Rs 238.00 Lacs from NABARD in 2020 for 5 years, Livelihood opportunities for 525 families have been planned in the 18 villages under Sirpur (U) and Lingapur Mandals of Komaram Bheem Asifabad district in Telangana. This project is being implemented on a pilot basis, only in two districts in the entire country.

In the year 2021-22, non-agriculture livelihoods and training were provided with the expenditure of Rs 73.15 Lacs. It was the first year of this project.

3. Livelihood and Enterprise Development Programmes (LEDPs)

With support of Rs 8.74 Lacs from NABARD in 2021, the 5 training programs of 10 days each

to the batches of 30 members on Organic Farming were conducted to introduce the farmers to the concept of organic farming in Adilabad & KB Asifabad.

It directly benefited 150 families and expected to have a cascading effect on many more in surroundings. The participants were screened from 59 villages in 8 mandals of Adilabad and Asifabad districts.

- 4. CBBO Partnered FPC Program**
With support of Small Farmers' Agri-Business Consortium (SFAC) and NABARD, Ekalavya Foundation, an empanelled Cluster Based Business Organization (CBBO) has the mandate to form and promote 4 new FPC covering 45 villages from 15 mandals in Kadapa, Vikarabad, Medak, Siddipet districts to benefit 12/600 farmers directly.

3 FPCs have already been registered covering 67 villages from 5 mandals in Adilabad and Mancherla districts benefiting 1048 farmers. A self-funded FPC having 106 farmer members from 9 villages from 1 mandal in Nirmal district has also been registered.

- 3. Village Empowerment**
1. Sustainability and Continuity Management Program (SCMP)

It is about ensuring that the developmental projects executed in the geo entity sustain the impact even after the completion of program and continue the momentum in spirit.

With this intent, the Grama Vikasa Samiti - GVS (Village Development Committee) was designed. These committees are totally volunteer based who have shown interest in the sustainability of their




ecosystem and maintaining the ecological balance.

In the year 2021-22, in over 250 villages, 547 village volunteers are engaged for development of their own villages.

2. Farmers clubs (FC):

Farmers in the village are organised under the umbrella of Farmers' club. These clubs are given various training on savings and collective mechanisms of finance management.

During the monthly meets, various issues related to agriculture and general issues related to village like implementation of govt schemes and related shramadanam are also discussed.

As of March 2022, there are 178 farmer clubs with 3941 members in 161 villages of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh.

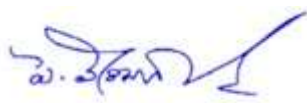
Women Clubs

Women clubs (WC) are formulated to promote the ownership and involvement of women in developmental activities.

WC functioning is similar to the farmer clubs and works in close association with the Farmer Club (FC) for the development of the village.

Sendriya Mitra:

Sendriya Mitra (loosely translated as "An Organic Friend") Project was initiated in the year 2018-19. The project was conceptualized to provide exposure to Organic Farming. This project is supported by NABARD/ GMR.




Under this initiative, the series of workshops and training camps are held in association with various educational institutions, scientists, experts and working professionals to bring in better clarity on concepts and practices in Organic Farming with special focus on Soil Conservation and Enrichment.

Promoted Organic Farming in 1937 Acres in 2021-22 across the Telugu states of Andhra Pradesh & Telangana.

Extensive workshops were conducted in over 154 villages regarding the organic concepts.

Overall, we have touched over 4500 acres with organic concepts till date.

Organic Crop Certification - Participatory Guarantee System (PGS)

PGS-India (Participatory Guarantee System of India) is a quality assurance initiative of Govt. of India allocated a Regional Council-PGS Certification to the Ekalavya Foundation for the certification of Organic Products. This certificate enables the farmers

1. To stay away from high cost of Third-Party Certification &
2. Farmers can collectively certify their crops under the scheme.

These certified products can be sold across the country through online platforms. The Foundation has been providing certification services in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana states from 2017.
